Our Approach

This RAP represents an independent commitment by GlofAI, positioned as a global Integrated AI Platform. It is focused on respectful engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples and embeds reconciliation principles into how we develop, deliver, and scale our AI platform.

While not part of the Reconciliation Australia accreditation program, this plan is firmly aligned with principles of inclusion, equity, and long-term partnership. We recognise that reconciliation is an ongoing journey that requires genuine commitment, accountability, and continuous learning.




Our Purpose

The governance principles that have sustained Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities for over 65,000 years—including stewardship, collective responsibility, and long-term thinking—provide valuable frameworks as we navigate the rapid development of artificial intelligence. By incorporating these perspectives, we aim to build technology that serves all communities equitably and respectfully.





Our Vision for Reconciliation

We envision a future where Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples are fully empowered participants in the AI-driven economy, contributing their unique perspectives and leading innovation that benefits all Australians.



Respected Custodians

Recognised as custodians of cultural and knowledge heritage with rights and protocols respected in digital spaces.



Economic Leaders

Leaders and contributors within the global AI-driven economy with equitable access to opportunities.



AI Partners

Partners in shaping responsible and ethical AI systems that reflect diverse cultural values.



Data Sovereignty Advocates

Advocates and decision-makers in Indigenous Data Sovereignty and digital rights protection.

- Commitment: We acknowledge past injustices and commit to contributing to a future of equity, inclusion, and opportunity for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples.

This vision recognises that true reconciliation requires more than acknowledgement—it demands action, investment, and a genuine commitment to sharing power and creating space for Indigenous leadership in the technology sector.

Guiding Principles of Our RAP

Our work is guided by five core principles that inform every decision we make, from platform design to partnership development. These principles ensure our actions align with our commitment to genuine reconciliation.



Respect

Honouring First Nations cultures, histories, and knowledge systems in all our interactions, products, and partnerships. This means listening deeply, learning continuously, and recognising that Indigenous knowledge has inherent value and authority.

Inclusion

Ensuring Indigenous participation in AI capability development and governance structures. We commit to removing barriers to access and creating pathways for meaningful involvement at all levels of our organisation and platform.

Partnership

Collaborating with Elders, communities, and Indigenous-led organisations as equal partners. We recognise that effective reconciliation requires shared decision-making and genuine co-design approaches.



Empowerment

Creating opportunities in leadership, employment, and education that enable Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples to thrive in the AI ecosystem. This includes scholarships, mentorship, and preferential pathways.

Sovereignty

Protecting Indigenous data rights and cultural knowledge through robust governance frameworks. We commit to upholding the principle that Indigenous Peoples have the right to control their own data and information.

These principles inform how we design our platform, develop our programs, and build our partnerships. They serve as a constant reminder that technology must serve people and cultures, not the other way around.

Key Objectives of the RAP

1. Cultural Understanding and Capability

Build cultural awareness and competency across GlofAI's people, products, and partners through training, engagement, and ongoing education.

- Mandatory cultural awareness training for all staff
- Integration of Indigenous perspectives in product development
- Partnership with cultural advisors and Elders

2. Indigenous Representation in AI Governance

Include Indigenous voices in AI standards, certification, and governance frameworks to ensure ethical and culturally responsive technology.

- Indigenous advisory board establishment
- Representation in certification processes
- Voice in policy development

3. Economic Participation and Workforce Pathways

Advance leadership, employment, and skills pathways for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples in AI through targeted programs.

- Indigenous employment targets and pathways
- Leadership development programs
- Skills training and mentorship

4. Community Partnerships and Collaboration

Develop long-term, respectful partnerships with Elders, communities, and Indigenous-led organisations that are based on mutual benefit and shared goals.

5. Responsible Data Sovereignty and Ethical AI

Advocate for and uphold Indigenous Data Sovereignty in how data is collected, managed, and used across all GlofAI platforms and services.

6. Supplier Diversity and Indigenous Procurement

Prioritise Indigenous-owned businesses within GlofAI's procurement and supplier ecosystem, creating economic opportunities and building capacity.

Practical Commitments 3 Access & Opportunity

Program Access Initiatives

We are committed to removing financial and systemic barriers that prevent Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples from accessing AI education and capability development. Our access initiatives include:

- 8% discount on all GlofAI programs and services for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, recognising historical disadvantage and creating equitable access
- Indigenous Leadership Scholarships to support participation in AI leadership and capability programs, covering full program costs and additional support
- Free access to AI awareness and ethical AI community sessions, ensuring knowledge sharing benefits entire communities
- Mentorship opportunities with global AI experts, providing guidance, networking, and career development support



Representation in Governance

We will ensure inclusion of Indigenous voices in certification and AI governance frameworks, recognising that diverse perspectives strengthen decision-making and lead to more ethical, culturally responsive technology solutions.



- Our goal is to create practical, tangible pathways into the AI ecosystem—not just statements of intent. Every commitment in this plan is designed to produce measurable outcomes that improve opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples.

These initiatives represent our first steps in building a more inclusive AI ecosystem. We recognise that true equity requires ongoing investment, continuous improvement, and willingness to adapt our approaches based on feedback from Indigenous communities and participants.

Monitoring & Accountability

Accountability is essential to meaningful reconciliation. We commit to transparent reporting and genuine measurement of our progress against the commitments outlined in this RAP.

Annual Public Updates

Comprehensive RAP progress reports published annually, tracking commitments and outcomes with full transparency.

Continuous Measurement

Ongoing tracking of key metrics across all commitment areas with regular data collection and analysis.



Biannual Internal Reviews

Regular internal assessments conducted every six months with input from Indigenous advisors and community partners.

Community Feedback

Regular consultation with Indigenous stakeholders to ensure our actions align with community needs and expectations.
